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to select materials that best meet the course learning objectives. For example, faculty should feel free to use open educational resources (OERs), traditional textbooks, and other educational materials based on their expert judgment and pedagogical concerns. However, faculty are not required to meet the lowcost/no-cost designation for courses." The chair of the Senate will take faculty concerns on this topic to the next meeting of the USG Faculty Council, when it meets with the Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor for Academic Affairs at the end of this month.

University Email List Policy

Faculty Senate has voted to endorse the proposed Email list policy outlined in the previous Senate newsletter. As a reminder, under this policy, official university messages will be sent through an "All-Employees" list. The All-Faculty list will remain in place but will move under the purview of the Provost's Office. The UWG Community and Events list will be renamed the UWG Items of Interest list, and it will continue to be opt-in.
